The Auditory Speech Sound Evaluation (ASE®) is a software package with psycho-acoustic tests for the hearing-impaired. One module uses isolated speech sounds for a discrimination, identification, and detection test. This is specifically suited to test preverbal children with no or very limited functional speech. Other modules are for loudness increase assessment, low frequency discrimination and identification with harmonic complexes and prosodic sounds and a 2-loudspeaker localization test. The ASE® is speech- and language independent. All tests allow strict analytical interpretation.

Workshop

One-day workshops with hands-on training are organized by the developers of the ASE® as an answer to the many requests from the field. The workshops are meant for audiologists, speech therapists and medical doctors with good audiological experience. Expertise in paediatric audiology is an advantage, but it is not a prerequisite.

A maximum of 5 participants per workshop will be accepted.

The workshops are given in English, but efforts are made to group participants who would prefer French or Dutch.
